

# Principal's Message

Dear Families.

We have made a positive start to the term after the week off. Year 11 students have shown fantastic commitment to their trial exams with a real positive mindset. I communicated my messages to students at the start of the week via a loom video. This included the following:

- We have renovated the safeguarding and wellbeing space which means students have another wonderful resource.
- Significant numbers of Year 11 students came in for additional sessions during half-term to help prepare for their exams
- Over 60 desks were repaired and replaced by the Site Team, as many had suffered from over 10 years of wear and tear
- Over 150 thank-you cards and chocolate bars were distributed before half term to students who regularly display our values (#excellence #responsibility #compassion)
- A reminder about mobile phones (we are a phone free school – they should be switched off and out of sight throughout the whole school day)
- We are having a big focus on stamping out derogatory language. All forms of discriminatory language (including sexist, racist, homophobic, Islamophobic & anti-Semitic will always be challenged)

Welcome back, and we hope you had a lovely half-term break. We are now in Term 4 for Year 8, and it's crazy how quickly the weeks and months have passed! During our Year Group's Assembly before the half-term break, I emphasized the unwaveringly high expectations set for all students in the academy. It's crucial that we maintain these standards, which are non-negotiable. Regrettably, there has been a slight dip in conduct within the year group. I urge you to communicate to your children some key expectations within the Academy.

A gentle reminder about our uniform policy. This includes wearing the Stockwood Park Blazer, a white shirt, grey trousers/skirt, the year group tie, and plain black leather shoes. While students are allowed one stud earring in each ear, please be aware that any other jewellery is not permitted.

On PE days, students are required to wear the TSPA PE top, plain black shorts/jogging bottoms, and their TSPA blazer. Hoodies are not to be worn during the school day, including break and lunch times. Coats should only be worn in outdoor areas, not inside the academy.

Punctuality is crucial for lessons and arriving promptly to school. Our school values - Responsibility, Compassion, and Excellence - from the core of our actions both inside and outside the classroom. Encourage our students to live out these values, creating an environment where everyone can thrive.

Exciting news about a Rewards Trip to Thorpe Park scheduled for 26th April 2024! To qualify, students must meet specific criteria over a 6-week period starting from 5th February to 22nd March 2024.

Requirements include:

# **Sparx Reader**

# **Reading Homework**

At TSPA students in Year 7 - 9 are expected to complete careful, independent reading each week as part of their homework.

Reading homework is set via the Sparx Reader platform, by their English teacher, and will be posted on Show My Homework. Students are expected to achieve at least 300 Sparx Reader Points each week, which equates to 30 minutes of careful reading. This is compulsory homework that every child in year 7 – 9 is expected to complete.

Students have been logging on to Sparx Reader for the first time over the last two weeks, during their English lessons.

## What is Sparx Reader?

- Sparx Reader is an online platform that supports students to achieve regular, independent, careful reading.
- The platform supports students to improve their reading development.
- Students can choose from a range of ebooks and, as they read, they'll see quick questions to check they're reading carefully.
- Careful readers earn points so they can track their progress and climb the league table!
- There will be rewards for careful readers and those who make good progress!
- Motivated readers who demonstrate consistent, careful reading will unlock Gold Reader, meaning they can read any paper book from the library or from home by scanning in its barcode.

If you have any questions about reading at TSPA or how to support and encourage your child to read, please do not hesitate to contact your child's English teacher in the first instance.

#### Support at Home

Sparx Reader adapts to each student's reading level, so it's important that you don't help by answering questions for your child. If you help your child, Sparx Reader might think they're a very strong reader and show them books that are too difficult.

The best way to support your child is to ask them about the book they're reading; what aspects they're enjoying, or what characters and events they've recently read about.



In addition, we will have lunchtime mini careers fairs taking place with a range of exhibitors from education, business and industry.





#### Welcome to The Stockwood Park Academy safeguarding bulletin!

This is our safeguarding bulletin where you can find many relevant mental health resources and advice such as how to ensure children are safe online, current issues such as vaping, healthy relationships and much more. Our aim is to provide valuable information for parents/ guardians to relevant concerns impacting children today, along with offering support, guidance and helpful knowledge.

#### Social media age limits

The age of your child as well as their developmental stage and maturity can affect their ability to have a safe and positive experience of social media.

Most of the popular social media services require users to be at least 13 years of age before they can register, although some sites are created especially for children under 13 (see Internet Matters' Social networks made for children).

The age requirements are there because of data protection laws. Online services are not allowed to collect or store children's personal information if they are under the age of 13. Data protection laws also say that only children aged 13 and over can sign up to online services without parental permission.

- Take time to be proactive

Students have already started to receive tokens to exchange for a brand new book to read and keep.




